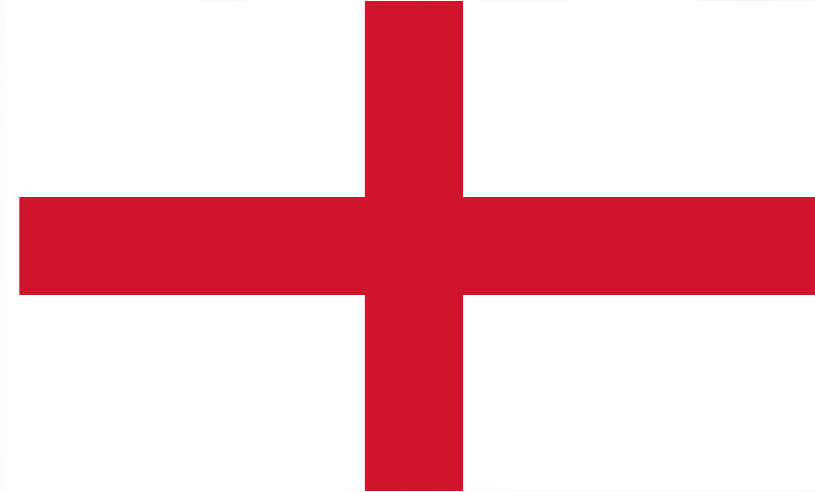

He joined Royal Wootton Bassett RFC aged 12 and gifted the club his first England shirt, being inspired by the likes of Sonny Bill Williams, Jerry Tuwai and Ellis Genge to pick up the oval ball.

The prop came through Bath's junior production line at Beechen Cliff being coached by Nathan Catt, with the duo resuming their partnership when Catt joined the RFU as pathway scrum coach.
